<p><i>Number Hunt</i> Create a number collage – use magazines, photos, packets, stamps etc. Stick them all together on some paper to make a collage.</p>	<p><i>Getting dressed</i> Practice getting yourself dressed for school in the morning, can you put on your own socks, shoes and coat? Can you fasten the zip on your coat?</p>	<p><i>Days of the week</i> Starting with Monday, can you say the days of the week in order? Can you remember the days of the week song? What activities do you do on which days? Can you learn when your birthday is?</p>	<p><i>Letter detective</i> Go on a letter hunt around the house or outside and find as many different letters as you can. Can you think of something that begins with the sounds you find?</p>
<p><i>Weather diary</i> Keep a weather diary over a week. You could add a drawing each day too.</p>	<p><i>Shopping list</i> Next time you are going to the shops, help to write a list of things you need, take it with you and tick them off as you find them.</p>	<p><i>Patterns</i> Can you make a repeating pattern? You could use toys, buttons, socks, lego. Try 2 or 3 things to repeat in your pattern</p>	<p><i>My space rocket journey</i> Imagine you are going to travel to Space! Can you think of 5 things that you would take to space in your rocket? You could have a go at writing them in a list.</p>
<p><i>Toy sorting</i> Choose some toys and sort them by shape or colour.</p>	<p><i>Christmas</i> Design and make a Christmas card or make a decoration for your tree.</p>	<p><i>Letter writing</i> Write a letter to father Christmas – make sure you use your manners!</p>	<p><i>Baking</i> Bake some tasty treats – can you follow the recipe, measure out the ingredients and set the oven timer?</p>
