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Shape Goat Headband

Supplies

- Shape goat cut-outs
- PVA glue
- Paintbrush or glue spreader
- Scissors
- Double sided tape or stapler



- A long strip of paper or card



- 1 First, carefully cut out all of the shape goat pieces. Make sure you cut down the line in the middle of the large grey circle to make 2 grey semicircles. Also cut along the lines on the large white circle to create two crescent shapes and a pointy oval shape.



- 2 Next, lay the large grey triangle in front of you with a point at the bottom and a flat edge along the top. This is going to be the goat's face!



- 3 Then, stick the grey semicircles onto the points at the top of the triangle for the goat's ears.



- 4 Next to the ears, carefully stick the two crescent shapes onto the top of the triangle, to look like the goat's horns.



- 5 Now, stick the pointy oval shape onto the point at the bottom of the triangle for the goat's beard.



- 6 Now make the goat's eyes. Carefully stick the small black circles onto the slightly larger white circles and then stick onto the large triangle face.



- 7 Next, stick the black triangle on for the goat's nose and the black semicircle for the goat's mouth and allow it to dry.



- 8 Take the long strip of paper or card and measure around your head. Secure the card into a ring shape that comfortably fits onto your head. Trim off any excess paper.



- 9 Once the goat's face is dry it can be stuck onto the front of the headband.

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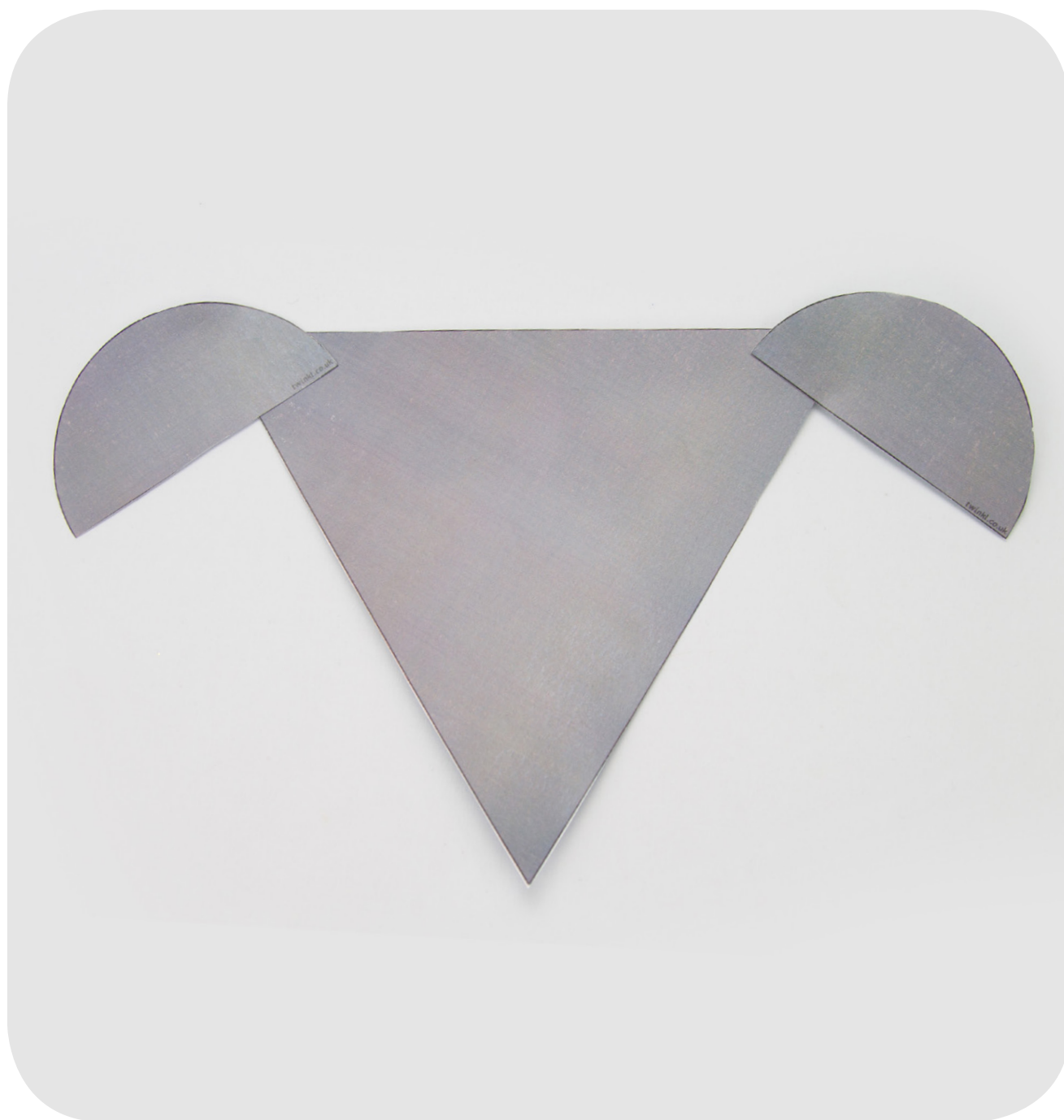




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
